Conduct Outreach and Set Goals

- Identify additional company foremen, company leaders and individuals in your payroll department who can help ensure success in your KIDstruction Week efforts.
- Talk to your company leader or corporate foundation about considering a corporate gift or matching gift donation.
- Set a fundraising goal!

Align with Payroll Department

- Talk to your payroll, employment services and/or human resources department about the KIDstruction Week campaign and how it will work at your company. Consider the following:
 - Determine the dates KIDstruction Week will take place at your company in August. Try to get a sense of how many tradespeople and professionals will be working and where.
 - Share this packet! Use this packet as a tool to prepare for KIDstruction Week.
 - Utilize the KIDstruction Week donation spreadsheet. It will be necessary for KIDstruction Week participants to be recorded in this format so that St. Louis Children's Hospital Foundation can properly acknowledge donations.
 - Bring along KIDstruction Week brochures to show payroll what you will be using to authorize payroll deductions.

Develop a Plan

- Work with your team of KIDstruction Week foremen to develop a plan to engage employees:
 - Think of how you can best reach each group with the information. Is it an email blast, check stuffer or safety lunch?
 - Try to get on the agenda at an upcoming company meeting. If there are no meetings scheduled, work toward getting something on the calendar.
- Show the KIDstruction Week video. To view the video, visit KIDstructionWeek.com.
- Engage project managers and superintendents to get them excited for KIDstruction Week and develop a plan to approach tradespeople at their sites:
 - Mention KIDstruction Week during your design/engineering meetings.
 - Send email reminders
 - Engage company executives

July

Kick-Off KIDstruction Week Campaign

- Display posters throughout your office and at worksites.
- Distribute KIDstruction Week brochures to employees.
- Add a QR code to internal promotions. Reach out to the St. Louis Children's Hospital Foundation team about making your team a personalized QR code that links to your company team page.
- Face-to-face contact is key! Be sure to get out there and offer every employee and tradesperson the opportunity to participate. The No. 1 reason that people do not contribute to good causes is because they are never asked.
- Use payroll stuffers with a personal note and link to the KIDstruction Week video. Add your signature for a personal touch.
- Post information and extra pledge forms at a central location on worksites such as in the office or by the time clock.
- Ask your colleagues about their past experiences with St. Louis Children's Hospital, whether as a supporter or as a patient or caregiver who has utilized their services.

Be Available to Answer Questions

- Be sure to send or post reminders so everyone gets a chance to participate.
- Communicate with your workforce about the success you are having with the campaign.
- Keeping your co-workers informed of your company's progress will make them feel they are part of a team and may encourage others to participate.

Turn in Employee Pledge Cards to Your Payroll Department

 Please turn in all your employee pledge forms to your payroll department before the start of your company's designated KIDstruction Week. This is essential to ensure every gift is honored. It also will allow you to have total dollars raised to share with your workforce during KIDstruction Week.

KIDstruction Week: Any Full Week in August

• Be sure to stay in contact with your workforce and remind them that with each hour they work during KIDstruction Week, they are making a difference in a child's life.

<u>August 30:</u> Payroll Deduction Worksheet Due to St. Louis Children's Hospital Foundation

- Complete the KIDstruction Week donation spreadsheet provided at KIDstructionWeek.com and email it to Kathryn Lodes at Kathryn.Lodes@bjc.org by August 30, 2024. It is important to utilize this template to ensure that all gifts are honored.
- Send a check for the total amount of employee payroll deductions, as well as any matching funds or corporate gifts, by August 30, 2024. Include any personal checks that have been turned in to your company foremen. Checks should be made payable to St. Louis Children's Hospital Foundation.
- Once your company check is received, St. Louis Children's Hospital Foundation will mail
 or email a gift acknowledgment letter for tax purposes to every employee who has made
 a gift.
 - All participants will receive a hard hat sticker.
 - Participants who have donated \$40 or more will receive a KIDstruction Week t-shirt.
 - Participants who have donated \$500 or more will receive a KIDstruction Week backpack cooler.

Please note: All apparel, coolers and hard hat stickers will be sent to your office to be distributed in the fall.

Finishing the Project

Collecting Donations

- Please encourage employees to make their donations by payroll deduction or online at KIDstructionWeek.com.
- For payroll deduction donations, you should collect the signed employee donation pledge forms and return them to your payroll department or whoever is tracking your company's gifts.

Recording Donations

- Please use the KIDstruction Week donation worksheet to record all donations. You will see the worksheet has a section to record all cash, check and payroll deduction donations. Please email this as an Excel spreadsheet to Kathryn Lodes at Kathryn.Lodes@bjc.org.
- St. Louis Children's Hospital Foundation will track online credit card donations from your company. Please reach out to Kathryn Lodes at <u>Kathryn.Lodes@bjc.org</u> to receive a list of online donors.

Turning In Donations

Once you have compiled and recorded all donations, please reach out to the St. Louis Children's Hospital Foundation team to schedule a delivery or pick-up. We ask that donations be turned in to St. Louis Children's Hospital Foundation by August 30, 2024. Please DO NOT MAIL cash donations.

Foreman Speaking Points

Hello everyone,

Common Questions

Common questions that you may hear and suggested responses that may help overcome them:

Q: I don't have any kids so why should I give?

A: Each year St. Louis Children's Hospital has about 275,000 visits, and thousands of them are children of our fellow professionals. Beyond that, St. Louis Children's supports kids in our community through a broad spectrum of outreach and advocacy programs. Chances are you know someone who has been helped by St. Louis Children's Hospital or who will need their services in the future.

Q: What's the point? What is my little donation really going to do anyway?

A: Your donation will make a big difference. Remember that KIDstruction Week is an industry-driven team effort. If everyone does a small part, together we can make a huge difference.

Q: Money is tight right now, I can't afford to donate that much. What should I do?

A: I understand. Just remember \$2 for every hour worked is a suggestion. Why don't you think about what you could afford to contribute? Every little bit helps.

Tip: Share a personal story, either from the video or perhaps your own experience with St. Louis Children's Hospital. This helps donors put themselves in someone else's shoes and see what a difference their donation could make.

Q: I don't live in St. Louis, so why should I give?

A: St. Louis Children's Hospital is one of the premier children's hospitals in the United States. It serves not just children from the St. Louis region, but also children across the country and around the world. St. Louis Children's Hospital has served patients from all 50 states and more than 80 countries.

Q: I already give to charity, why should I give to this too?

A: This is a special opportunity for us to do something as an industry. By coming together, we have the potential to make KIDstruction Week a huge success. As a group, we can help thousands of sick kids every year. St. Louis Children's Hospital depends on community-based fundraising programs to do what's right for kids. Dollars raised will allow St. Louis Children's to continue providing the very best pediatric care through cutting-edge medicine, research, innovative programs and community outreach.

Q: Is my donation tax-deductible?

A: Yes. All KIDstruction Week participants will get a thank you letter from St. Louis Children's Hospital with information for tax purposes. Your donation is 100% tax deductible.
